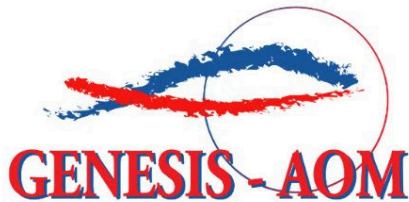

Mongolia Update - 2st Quarter 2026

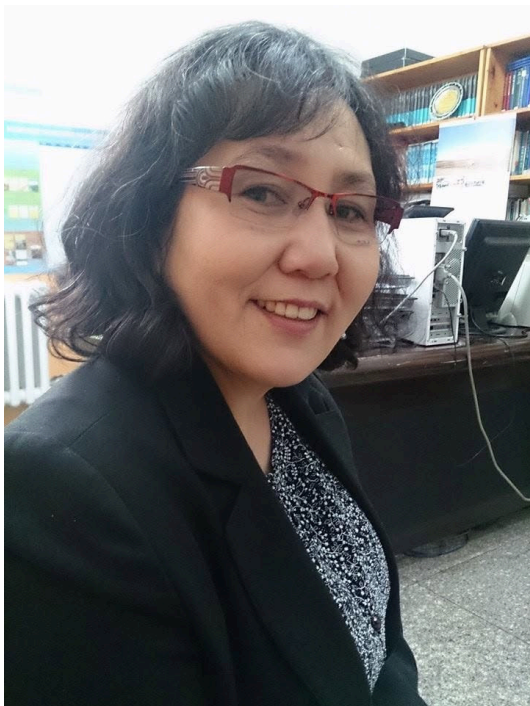


King's Kids" 2026 Overview

This summer, 520 children heard the basics of the Gospel through five-day outreach camps hosted by 14 local churches across Uvs, Ulaanbaatar, and Tuv provinces. Each child needs \$14 for a discipleship manual and one meal a day. We've already seen encouraging stories of lives being touched, and funding for 200 of these children is still needed.

Pastor Khaliun, Amen Grace Church:

Our church is located in a ger district in Ulaanbaatar. In the past, we had a Sunday school teacher and many kids coming, but without a teacher, we couldn't keep the children's ministry going. Our adult congregation had also grown very small, making it a difficult season with few people to serve. Even so, I stepped out in faith to run the "King's Kids" program.

Though I was serving mostly on my own, one woman came to help. From the very first day, many children arrived, and for five days, the church building was filled with noise and joy! It was spiritually

Pastor B. Munguntsetseg, Living Faith Church, Nalaikh:

Two churches joined forces to run a 5-day "King's Kids" craft workshop. A total of 43 children participated—31 of whom had previously taken the "Good Child" course, and 7 who had received winter kits. Our church invited the "Good Child" students to three different Gospel events, and it was wonderful to see our church kids inviting their classmates. With summer break starting, many kids admitted they were bored at home with nothing to do except play on their phones. Doing this 3-day program right at that time was deeply appreciated by both the children and their parents.

Odzaya:

She has opened up a lot in her relationships with others. She has been sharing about Jesus with her old and new friends and taking ownership in everything she does. She showed a strong interest in praise and worship through her words and actions, coming up front to lead and serve during worship. We see this as a strong foundation for her to grow into a future Sunday school teacher. She continues to attend church regularly with the friends she brought along.

The day-care program and outreach ministry we organized in Sagil soum went as planned and ended with great success. Through this work, we made a positive impact on the local youth and showed God's love in practical ways. Starting on the second day, even the school principal and the deputy governor of the soum personally called and brought children to join. Seeing this made us deeply thankful to God.



CHURCH PLANT



A New Church Rising in Far West Mongolia

Last year, Chimedee made the courageous decision to close his carpentry shop in Ulaangom, and his wife stepped down from her job as a school counselor. Driven by a vision to serve, they relocated their family to start a church in Umnugobi soum, a remote herding village in the far west of Mongolia.

For years, G-AOM supported Chimedee's outreach trips to Umnugobi and neighboring Ulgii soums. Through these faithful visits and relationships built through our Winter Kits project since 2023, several teenagers surrendered their lives to Christ. To help Chimedee's family sink deep roots into the community, we helped them purchase a piece of land to settle in Umnugobi.

Their one-year commitment to discipling these young believers has yielded incredible fruit. Transformed by faith, the teenagers began sharing the Gospel with their peers. Today, Sunday attendance has grown to 30 teenagers, with several stepping up to lead worship.

To support his family and sustain the ministry, Chimedee began baking and selling homemade bread in the village. The local demand has grown so fast that he now needs commercial baking equipment specifically an electric doughnut maker, a dough cutter, a depositor, and a baking oven.

A Letter from Executive Director, SISI

Dear friends and partners,

Sixteen years ago I joined Genesis-AOM. After six years at home with my children, I stepped back into ministry. For the last ten years I have walked with God and this team toward the vision He gave us.

I did not come with a clear calling to children. That came later. God made it unmistakable: every child should know Him, encounter His love, and live for His Kingdom.

In 2013 we launched Good Child in Nalaikh. Ulzii and I drove out every week—I was a brand-new driver, she was heavily pregnant. After school we held clubs in Mrs. Mungoo's home church, carrying coal to keep the ger warm.

One classroom. That was the start.

Today Good Child serves more than 900 children in every public school in Nalaikh and reaches over 4,000 children a year as we expand into other provinces. God is leading this work. His Kingdom keeps growing.

Your partnership turns dollars into changed families. Twenty-six dollars reaches one child and their parents with values and skills that last a lifetime.

Home Visits in Omnogovi Province

We teach "Good Child" lessons to seven 4th-grade classes and five 5th-grade classes at School No. 1. This term, we conducted three home visits:



Mendbayar (Grade 4E): Mendbayar lives in a run-down house in a shared yard where his visually impaired mother works hard to support him despite her disability. Embarrassed by his living conditions, Mendbayar was very self-conscious, quiet, and uncertain about his future. After taking the lesson on *Inner and Outer Beauty*, his mindset changed completely. He realized he shouldn't feel ashamed of his life and has become much happier and more confident.



Nominjin (Grade 4B): Nominjin used to be very quiet and sad, always looking like she was on the verge of tears. She lives with her aunt because her parents struggle with alcoholism. Her older brother spends a lot of time wandering the streets. We chose to visit her home because of these difficult conditions. Since participating in "Good Child" classes, her eyes light up, and she now attends every lesson with great joy and active participation.



Onomunkh (Grade 5V): Onomunkh lacked confidence and struggled to write simple letters when we first observed him, which broke my heart and made me want to visit his home. While his home environment is caring, he spends too much time on screens. Since joining our class and serving as my assistant, he has become much more active and engaged. When we visited him in a mascot costume with gifts, his face lit up with joy.



Suvd-Erdene (Grade 5D): When our program started, Suvd-Erdene was struggling with deep depression and thoughts of suicide. She refused to speak with others, gave dirty looks, and had no friends. Since joining the classes, she has gradually opened up, made friends, and treats her classmates with kindness and respect.



Aldarmunkh (Grade 5B): Aldarmunkh is very active in class and grasps the core ideas of the lessons quickly. Because his parents work long hours from morning until evening, he helps his grandmother take care of his baby sibling. We visited his home to encourage him for his hard work and growth.



My name is Khuslen. Three years ago, when I was in 5th grade at Golomt School, a wonderful class called "Good Child" was taught in our classroom. Our teacher was named B. Mungoo. Everyone in our class was very active during Mrs. Mungoo's lessons and never misbehaved. Unlike other teachers, she interacted with us in a much closer, kinder, and more joyful way. When school ended in the spring, Mrs. Mungoo gave us invitations to her church gathering. That was how I first went to church and heard the Gospel of Christ.

Now, I am in 9th grade. I serve as a youth teacher at my church. My father had the worst reputation in our district, committed crimes, and never showed me love, care, or attention. But when I heard that God created me, always loves me, and is always

there for me, I accepted God right away and put my faith in Him. My mother has come to church with me several times, and my friends continue to come along as well.

Thanks to the "Good Child" class coming to my classroom, I met Jesus and was saved. Going forward, I want to know God even more. I have come to believe that God has a truly wonderful plan for me.
