

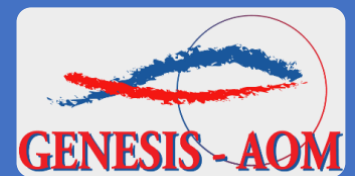

“Winter Kits” Project Report 2025

Bringing Warmth and Hope Across Mongolia

When winter arrives in Mongolia, temperatures go far below freezing. For many low-income families, providing warm coats and boots for their children is simply impossible. Without proper winter clothing, children miss school, become sick, and fall behind in their education. The “Winter Kits” Project was launched to change that reality in 2013.

From January 2 to December 20, 2025, the project served children in Ulaanbaatar and 12 provinces: Bulgan, Uvs, Khuvsgul, Sukhbaatar, Umnugovi, Dornod, Khentii, Tuv, Arkhangai, Darkhan, Govi-Altai, and Govisumber.

Led by Project Coordinator D. Ulziikhishig of Genesis AOM NGO, this initiative united churches and volunteers across Mongolia with one shared mission: **to keep children warm and to share the hope of the Gospel with their families.**

Lives Touched in 2025

This year:

- **250 volunteers** from **67 churches** across 13 provinces served together.
- **1,000 children** received winter coats and boots.
- **535 families** were personally visited in their homes.
- **465 children** made a decision to believe in Jesus Christ and are now being supported by local church communities.

Since the project began in 2013, a total of **5,819 children** has received winter clothing by the end of 2025.

Behind every number is a story — a child walking confidently to school in warm boots, a mother relieved that her child will not freeze, a family opening their home to prayer and encouragement.

More Than Clothing: Building Faith Foundations

The Winter Kits Project is not only about physical warmth — it is about spiritual growth. In June 2025, our team developed a comprehensive discipleship manual to support churches in guiding children and families.

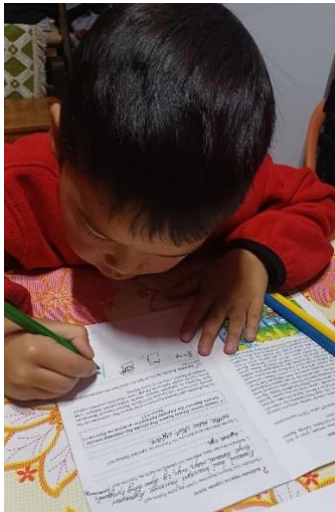
- 1,100 manuals were printed and distributed to 67 participating churches.
- Discipleship meetings were launched nationwide.

Before receiving their winter kits in mid-October, every participating child attended four weeks of Gospel teaching, building understanding and trust within their local church community.

Lasting Impact

The “Winter Kits” Project meets practical needs while opening doors to share God’s love in action. Many families were deeply thankful and receptive to the message of hope.

Local churches continue to follow up with these families through visits and basic Christian teaching. The project also helps churches build stronger relationships with local government authorities by actively serving their communities.



Other Contributions

Volunteers from New Zealand visited Genesis and helped pack the jackets and boots. They also brought 1,000 hand-knitted warm beanies, which were given to each child together with their winter jacket and boots.

We are deeply grateful to all individuals and overseas partner organizations who generously donated, raised funds, and supported this ministry of love through their prayers and financial contributions.

Their partnership made it possible to bring warmth and hope to many families across Mongolia.



Testimony 1: Naraa, 12 years old

Naraa is a 12-year-old orphan living with his grandparents in Rashaant District, Bulgan Province. His grandparents are herders in the countryside. Because of his difficult situation, he often stays in a school dormitory or with different relatives, with very little supervision. He did not have a proper winter coat or boots and was wearing sneakers during the winter.

After faithfully attending the “Gift of Love” classes, Naraa decided to accept the Lord into his life.



Testimony 2: Oyunaa, 11 years old

Oyunaa comes from a family of five. She lives with her grandmother in the district center and attends school there. Her grandmother has a disability, and her father struggles with alcohol addiction. At present, both of her parents are unemployed.



Oyunaa:

“I am so happy that I can spend this winter with warm clothes. Before, I only had sneakers to wear in the winter. The most amazing thing is that it started snowing the day after I received my new boots and coat! I believe that Jesus is real. Thank you for choosing me among so many children.”

Grandmother:

“Thank you very much for giving my granddaughter such beautiful and warm clothes. May your work be blessed and continue to grow. She lives far from her parents and stays with me, so life is not easy for her. We are truly grateful.”

Testimony 3: G. Michidmaa, 14 years old

Background:

Michidmaa lives with her parents and two younger siblings. She previously stayed with her grandfather, but after he passed away, she returned to live with her parents. Because she grew up away from them, she does not have a close relationship with her mother and father.

Her family situation is very difficult. Her parents are at high risk of divorce, and her father struggles with a gambling addiction.



G. Michidmaa's Testimony:

"My parents argue all the time. They fight almost every day, and it makes life very difficult. My father's gambling causes many problems, and my mother becomes very upset.

Since I started going to church, many things have changed in my life. As I learn more about God, my heart feels calmer, and my emotional struggles have become lighter. I enjoy spending time with the other children during fellowship at church. When I share about my problems at school or at home and pray about them, I begin to feel peace again.

There was a time when my parents were very close to divorce. My mother had already decided to leave. I prayed to God about it, and after that, their relationship began to improve. I am still praying for them."

Testimony 4

Namuungoo, 6 years old

Namuungoo lives with her father, older sister, and younger sibling. Their mother left the family, and the children now live with their father. He leaves early in the morning for work and returns late in the evening, so the children stay home alone most of the day without supervision.

The girls are always very happy when church members visit their home. We have been bringing them to church to attend the "Winter Kits" Good News lessons.

The children in this family suffer from malnutrition, and their physical growth is slow. They are often bullied by classmates. At first, their father was very closed and unwilling to meet or talk with us. However, when we told him about providing winter clothes for his children, he began to open up and share about his struggles.



Father's Words:

“With several children and a demanding job, it is hard for me to give them the attention they need. Thank you for caring for us during this difficult time in our lives. I will send my children to church.”

Testimony 5

Bayaraa, 9 years old

Bayaraa lives in Naranbulag District, Uvs Province, with his mother, two older sisters, and two younger siblings. His mother has been married three times, and each marriage ended in separation. She is now raising her children on her own.

When we met Bayaraa's mother, she shared her painful story of being left by three husbands. Listening to her reminded us of the Samaritan woman in the Bible. After hearing the Good News of the Lord, she accepted it with an open heart and was filled with great joy.



Bayaraa, 9 years old

Bayaraa lives in Naranbulag district, Uvs Province, with his mother, two older sisters, and two younger siblings. His mother has been married and separated three times. Currently, she lives with her children.

We met and spoke with Bayaraa's mother. She shared that she had been with three different husbands and they left her each time. Hearing her story felt exactly like listening to the story of the Samaritan woman. Upon hearing the Good News of the Lord, Bayaraa's mother accepted it and was filled with great joy.



Testimony 6

Turbold, 9 years old

Turbold lives in Uvs Province with his 12-year-old older brother and his younger brother. Both of their parents struggled with alcohol addiction and have passed away.

The boys are being looked after by relatives who live nearby and check on them from time to time. However, they are growing up without much love and daily care.

Ganbaatar, a leader from the Uvs church, shared the Good News with them. Since then, the boys have come to enjoy attending church and spending time there.
